

ANZAC

On 25 April 1915, Australians led a massive and multi-national amphibious attack on Turkey when they landed on beaches around a small cove on the western shore of the Gallipoli Peninsula.

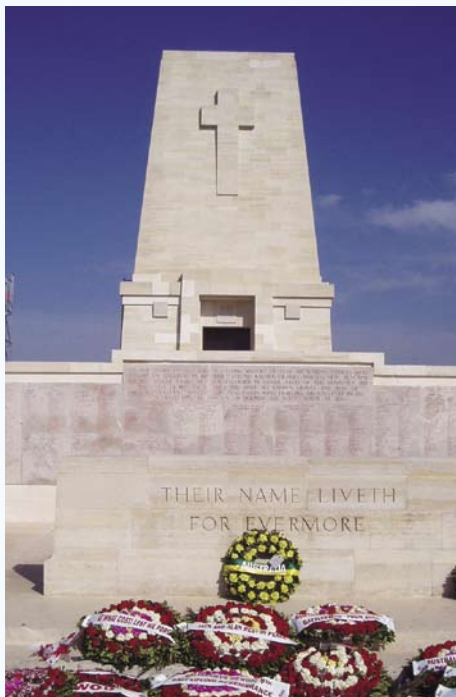
The eight and a half month campaign that followed has become a defining period in the history of both Australia and Turkey.

The old Gallipoli battlefields endured constant artillery and sniper fire and were ravaged by disease. Now the graveyards are their enduring memorials nestled among the gullies and along spectacular ridge lines with names that have become part of our folklore; Shrapnel Valley, Beach Cemetery, Lone Pine and the Nek. In Shrapnel Valley visitors can still walk the path used by Simpson and his donkey; and visit his burial site at Beach Cemetery.

Lone Pine, now the site of the largest Australian Cemetery, was once the scene of some of the bloodiest close quarter fighting of the campaign.

Today the panoramic views from the Nek seem to amplify the senselessness of the charge that saw two regiments of Light Horse wiped out for no gain. Be part of remembering the first major military engagement fought by Australian and New Zealand Forces. The national commemoration is an occasion which builds on the character of what our past generations have fought for, not just in the First World War.

The Dawn Service venerates the time when soldiers would be woken in the dark to be manning their post once dawn breaks.

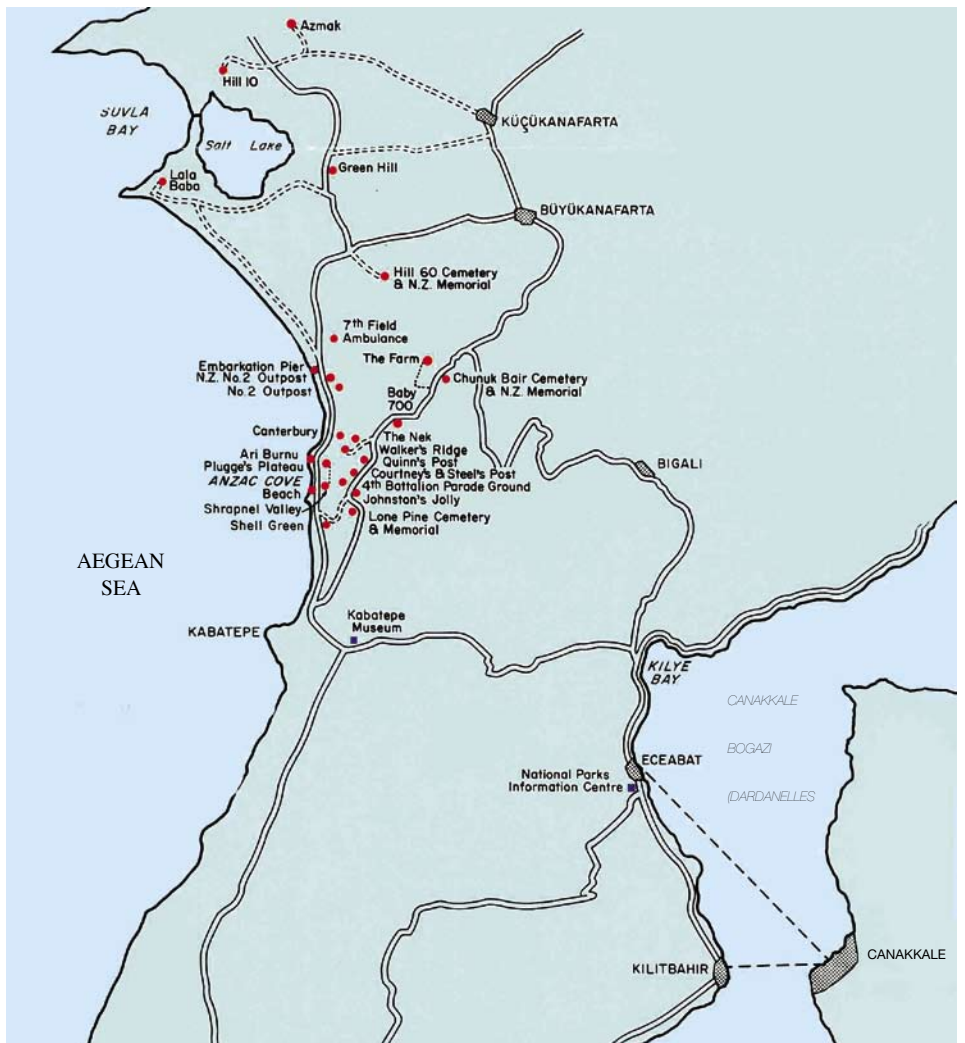


YOUR WAR HISTORIAN

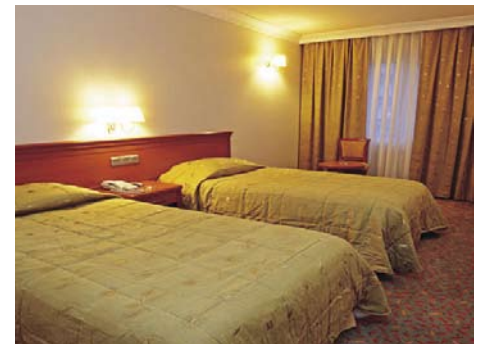
